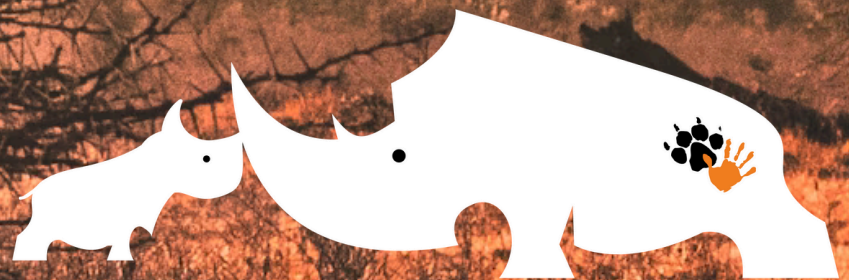

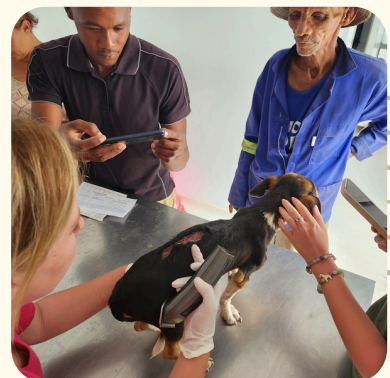

5

Participate in a necropsy to learn about wildlife health and disease management, then assist with fieldwork or ongoing animal care.

6

Explore the legendary Kruger National Park or Panorama Route, experiencing South Africa's diverse wildlife and stunning landscapes.

7

Visit the Endangered Species Centre to learn about conservation and rehabilitation efforts for endangered species.

- ✎ Working alongside renowned field biologists in the fields of herpetology, ornithology, entomology, and mammalogy
- ✎ Hands-on field conservation through bio blitz methods
- ✎ Directly support the fundraiser for the creation of two protected areas in Ecuador.
- ✎ Monitor transects for the rapid-response monitoring of the Mindo Harlequin-Toad
- ✎ Set up light traps for insects to photograph beetles, moths, and mantids on a white background.
- ✎ Set up pitfall traps to record secretive leaf-litter species that are otherwise extremely hard to find.
- ✎ Record all birds seen or heard from various points at the reserves Mist nets will be set up to record elusive understory species
- ✎ Learn the art of scientific photographing using standardized methods
- ✎ Live amongst nature in elegant eco cabins situated at the edge of a cliff and in the cloud forest

Welcome to Quito, the capital of Ecuador
Meet your colleagues and settle in for dinner

2

Enjoy the picturesque drive known for its waterfalls and birdwatching before arriving in the Arlequín Reserve in the Mindo cloudforest. Set up your BioBlitz stations and spend the evening briefing about the project

3-5

Daytime activities include visiting trap stations, diurnal surveys along transects, and scientific white background photography. Nighttime activities include photography of insects in light traps, herpetological visual encounter surveys, and examination of mist nets to record bat species

6

Travel across the high Andes of Ecuador to the Pitalala Reserve in the upper Amazon rainforest of Ecuador. Set up the next set of Bio Blitz stations and begin monitoring this night

7-9

You will spend four nights immersed in the rainforest of Pitalala Reserve building up the species lists of reptiles, amphibians, mammals, birds, beetles, moths, butterflies, and aquatic invertebrates.

At the end of each sampling day, the team will gather to annotate the recorded species on a whiteboard

10

Enjoy a last breakfast with the team before heading back to Quito to depart

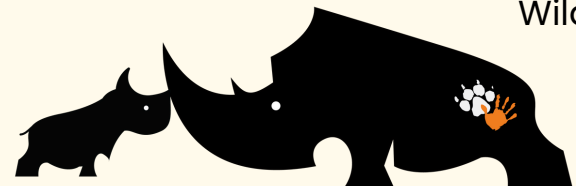

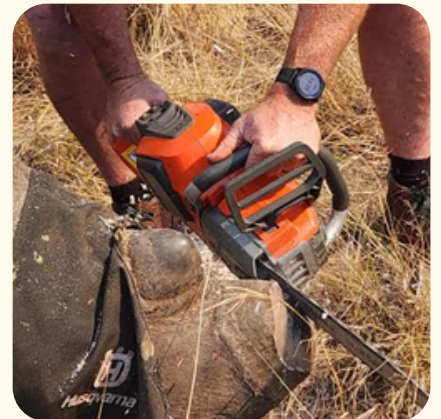

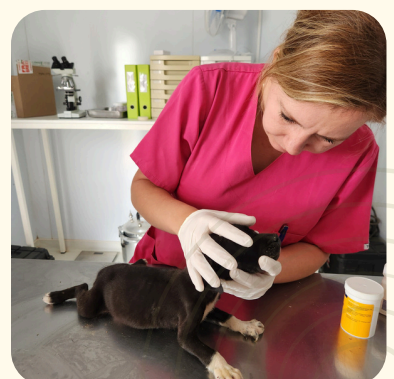
