Conservation in Action

We operate across key conservation regions in Africa and Central America, where wildlife faces growing threats from human-wildlife conflict, habitat fragmentation, harmful superstitions, the illegal wildlife trade, and the exotic pet market.

In Africa, our work spans South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Namibia and Malawi, focusing on protecting vulnerable species and restoring ecosystems under pressure while empowering local communities on the importance of preserving the ecosystem.

In Central and South America, we support vital conservation efforts in Costa Rica, Guatemala, Ecuador, The Galapagos and Belize, areas rich in unique wildlife and natural heritage.

These regions urgently need support to address the complex challenges threatening both animals and the environments they depend on.

We work alongside a diverse network of professionals—wildlife veterinarians, rehabilitation specialists, marine biologists, ecologists, and wildlife forensics experts—to deliver targeted, impactful solutions. There is also the opportunity for longer internships and specific research partnerships for those looking to contribute more deeply to our work.

Each year, we grow our reach, forming new partnerships and helping more species recover and thrive in the wild.



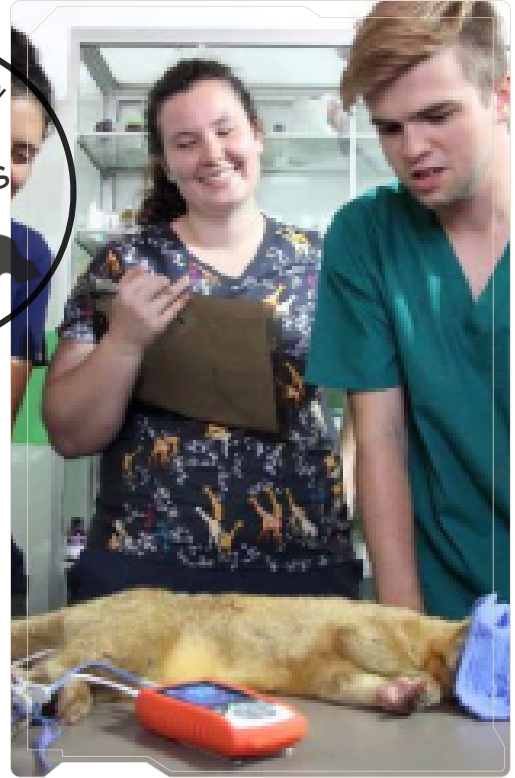

Experience the full wildlife rehabilitation journey as you shadow a vet through rescue, treatment, recovery, and release in a real conservation setting.

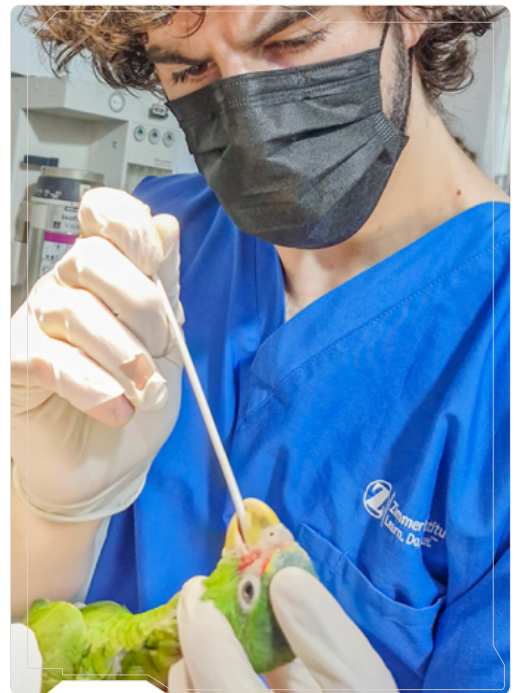

Join forces with expert wildlife veterinarians at the country's leading rescue and rehabilitation center, where you'll gain hands-on experience caring for incredible native species. Take part in clinical procedures from intake to recovery—administer injections, collect samples, assist in surgeries and treatments, and observe diagnostic practices firsthand. Dive deep into the world of neotropical primates, parrots, reptiles, and carnivores through engaging lectures and case-based discussions focused on Wildlife Medicine, One Health, and Conservation. Get practical training in animal handling, safe capture techniques, enrichment strategies, and husbandry, including feeding and behavioral observation. During your stay, you'll also join the annual health checks for resident animals—an incredible chance to sharpen your skills in wildlife care and vet procedures. And to top it off? Experience a thrilling two-day journey to the iconic Tikal National Park, where ancient Mayan ruins meet rich jungle biodiversity for the ultimate archaeological and wildlife exploration!

- 5 - 17 January 2026 - Best suited to pre vets with clinical experience and early years of vet/tech studies
- 20 April - 2nd May 2026 - Best suited to 1st to 4th year vet and tech students
- 6 - 18 July 2026 - Open to students and qualified vets/techs, as well as pre vets with clinical experience
- 17 - 29 August 2026 - Best suited to 1st to 4th year vet and tech students

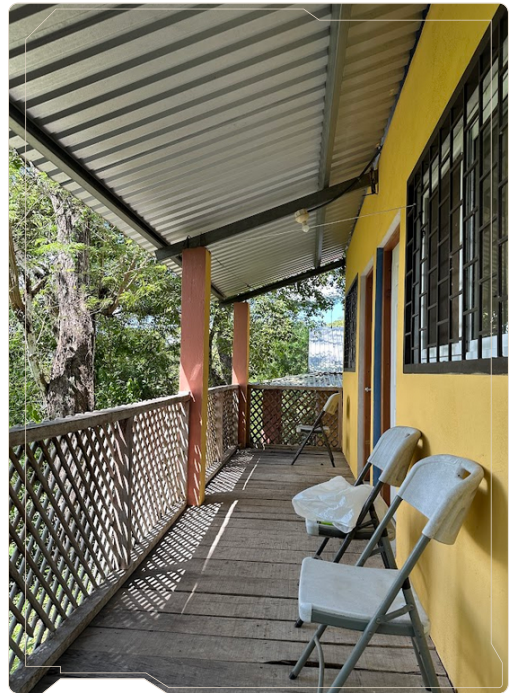
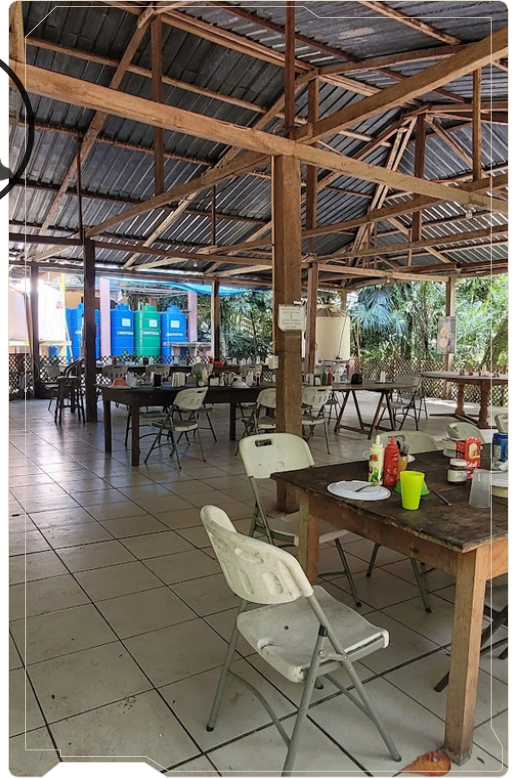

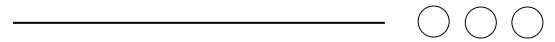
- Travel insurance (mandatory)
