Conservation in Action

We operate across key conservation regions in Africa and Central America, where wildlife faces growing threats from human-wildlife conflict, habitat fragmentation, harmful superstitions, the illegal wildlife trade, and the exotic pet market.

In Africa, our work spans South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Namibia and Malawi, focusing on protecting vulnerable species and restoring ecosystems under pressure while empowering local communities on the importance of preserving the ecosystem.

In Central and South America, we support vital conservation efforts in Costa Rica, Guatemala, Ecuador, The Galapagos and Belize, areas rich in unique wildlife and natural heritage.

These regions urgently need support to address the complex challenges threatening both animals and the environments they depend on.

We work alongside a diverse network of professionals—wildlife veterinarians, rehabilitation specialists, marine biologists, ecologists, and wildlife forensics experts—to deliver targeted, impactful solutions. There is also the opportunity for longer internships and specific research partnerships for those looking to contribute more deeply to our work.

Each year, we grow our reach, forming new partnerships and helping more species recover and thrive in the wild.

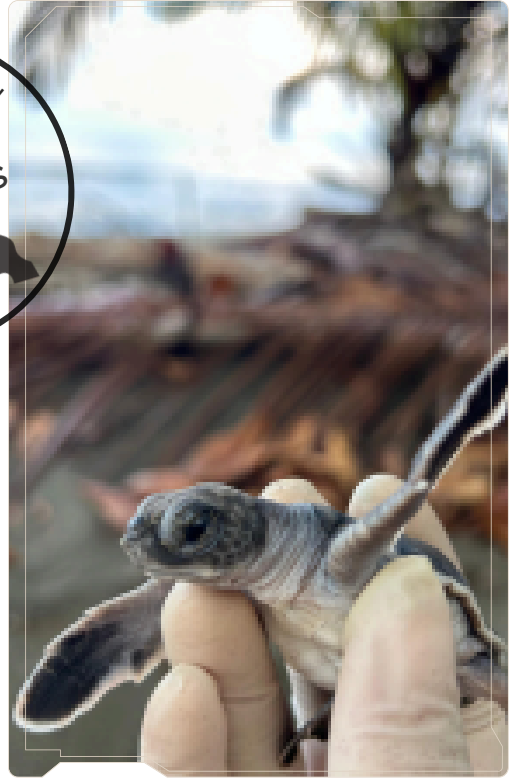
Work alongside a dedicated team of experts at a beachside conservation site in Costa Rica, where you'll play a crucial role in protecting endangered sea turtles. Your responsibilities will include transferring sea turtle eggs to secure hatcheries to protect them from poaching and increase their chances of survival. You'll take part in wellness checks on nesting turtles, assessing body and shell condition, behavior, and providing basic rehabilitation if needed. You'll also help collect vital data, such as shell size, identification tagging, nest location, and egg counts. Participate in both day and night beach patrols to monitor nesting activity and support ongoing research. When hatchlings reach about 45 days old, you'll assist in their release back into the ocean after gathering important growth data. Beyond turtle conservation, you'll engage in impactful community outreach programs, teaching local children about the environment, sea turtles, conservation, English, and recycling. Help clean the beaches and support local recycling initiatives to protect the fragile coastal ecosystem. During your downtime, fall asleep to the sound of the waves, visit nearby eco-lodges, or explore the renowned Corcovado National Park. Your experience also includes exciting tours to Isla Tortuga by boat, a volcano and coffee farm, a family-run chocolate farm, and a cultural tour of San José.

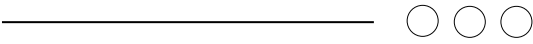

Turtle Season



Sea turtle activity varies each year, but this guide provides a general overview of the nesting and hatching seasons along the coastline. While nature follows its own rhythm, patterns have shown that Olive Ridley turtles are the most common visitors, with around 6,000 nests typically recorded each season. In contrast, the endangered Green Turtle is less frequent, with about 600 nests on average. High and low seasons depend on the species and weather patterns, so timing can shift from year to year. Use this guide as a helpful reference—but remember, these incredible creatures remain wild and unpredictable.

7 Day Itinerary

DAY 1

Welcome to Costa Rica – The Journey Begins: Touch down in San José, Costa Rica's vibrant capital, before boarding a scenic domestic flight to the breathtaking Osa Peninsula. As you soar above lush rainforests and dramatic coastlines, the adventure begins in the sky. Upon landing, meet your turtle conservation team — a passionate group of biologists and volunteers who will become your family for the week. Settle in and listen to the sounds of nature as you're surrounded by monkeys, birds, tapirs, and more, immersing yourself in the vibrant wildlife of the area.

DAY 2 - 6

Dive Into Turtle Conservation & Coastal Living; Get ready to roll up your sleeves and make a real impact. For the next five days, you'll join a hands-on sea turtle conservation project on one of Costa Rica's most important turtle beaches.

 Your Mission Includes:

- Assist in the transfer of sea turtle eggs to a protected hatchery, safeguarding them from poaching and giving hatchlings the best chance of survival.
- Conduct wellness checks on nesting turtles—monitoring their shell and body condition, behavior, and providing basic aid when needed.
- Help with data collection including identification tagging, nest documentation, egg counts, and more to support long-term research.
- Take part in day and night patrols along the beach, monitoring for nesting activity and ensuring turtle safety.
- Assist in the release of hatchlings—about 45 days after hatching—while recording important growth and size data.

Community Engagement

- Join educational outreach programs, teaching local children about sea turtles, environmental conservation, English, and recycling.

Participate in beach clean-ups and support local recycling initiatives to help preserve the region's natural beauty.

DAY 7

Farewell (For Now): Say goodbye to your new friends (human and turtle alike) and catch a return flight to San José. From there, connect to your international flight — or continue your Costa Rican adventure. Whether you're heading home or diving deeper into the wild beauty of this country, you'll leave with unforgettable memories, new skills, and a heart full of purpose.

11 Day Itinerary

DAY 1

Arrival and Stay in San José: Kick off your journey with a relaxing stay in Costa Rica's bustling capital, where rich culture and vibrant energy create the perfect backdrop for your upcoming adventures.

DAY 2

Head To The Capital: Your final morning on the Osa Peninsula is a chance to savor the peaceful energy of the rainforest before heading to the airstrip for your scenic flight back to San José. Upon arrival in the capital, enjoy a restful stay in your private room.

DAY 10

Poás Volcano, Waterfall & Coffee Tour: Experience the stunning volcanic landscapes of Poás Volcano National Park, visit majestic waterfalls, and tour a local coffee farm to learn about one of Costa Rica's most famous exports.

DAY 11

Time to Depart: Enjoy a relaxed final morning in San José. Depending on your flight time, take a short walk, have breakfast at the hotel, or pick up any last-minute souvenirs. When ready, transfer to SJO Airport to catch your international flight home — or continue your journey through beautiful Costa Rica.
