# Conservation in Action

We operate across key conservation regions in Africa and Central America, where wildlife faces growing threats from human-wildlife conflict, habitat fragmentation, harmful superstitions, the illegal wildlife trade, and the exotic pet market.



In Africa, our work spans South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Namibia and Malawi, focusing on protecting vulnerable species and restoring ecosystems under pressure hile empowering local communities on the importance of preserving the ecosystem.

In Central and South America, we support vital conservation efforts in Costa Rica, Guatemala, Ecuador, The Galapagos and Belize, areas rich in unique wildlife and natural heritage.

These regions urgently need support to address the complex challenges threatening both animals and the environments they depend on.

We work alongside a diverse network of professionals—wildlife veterinarians, rehabilitation specialists, marine biologists, ecologists, and wildlife forensics experts—to deliver targeted, impactful solutions. There is also the opportunity for longer internships and specific research partnerships for those looking to contribute more deeply to our work.

Each year, we grow our reach, forming new partnerships and helping more species recover and thrive in the wild.





## WILDE TRACKS

### WildeTurtle

Join a meaningful sea turtle conservation project in Costa Rica, where you'll work alongside a qualified biologist at a beachside research site. You'll help collect vital data on population structure, genetic origin, and inwater habitats of endangered sea turtles. Full-board meals and accommodation are provided in a welcoming local community right on the beachfront. Your hands-on role includes participating in the rehabilitation of injured or ill turtles, and learning essential research methods such as restraint, measuring, weighing, microchipping, and collecting tissue and blood samples, while also checking for any injuries or abnormalities. You'll also contribute to mangrove development and replanting efforts, which are crucial to supporting turtle foraging grounds. Take to the water for fullday passive turtle catching to support data analysis shared across conservation networks in Central and South America. Beyond the fieldwork, you'll engage with the local community's initiatives in recycling, education, and women's empowerment. You may also have the chance to be involved in unique night-time water collection studies if scheduled.

### 7 Day Itinerary

### DAY 1

Welcome to Costa Rica – The Journey Begins: Touch down in San José, Costa Rica's vibrant capital, before boarding a scenic domestic flight to the breathtaking Osa Peninsula. As you soar above lush rainforests and dramatic coastlines, the adventure begins in the sky. Upon landing, meet your turtle conservation team — a passionate group of biologists and volunteers who will become your family for the week. Settle into your beachfront accommodation and take your first breath of fresh ocean air as the sun sets over the Pacific.

### **DAY 2 - 6**

Dive Into Turtle Conservation & Coastal Living; Get ready to roll up your sleeves and make a real impact. For the next five days, you'll join a hands-on sea turtle conservation project alongside experienced marine biologists on one of Costa Rica's most important turtle beaches.

- Collecting crucial data on sea turtle population, genetics, and habitats
- Assisting with rehabilitation of injured turtles learn to measure, weigh, microchip, and conduct health checks
- Participating in in-water turtle catching expeditions (non-invasive), a thrilling full-day adventure
- Helping restore vital ecosystems through mangrove replanting
- Supporting local sustainability through recycling initiatives, education programs, and women's empowerment projects

Depending on the schedule, you may also join night-time water studies, helping gather rare behavioral data under the stars.

### DAY 7

Farewell (For Now): Say goodbye to your new friends (human and turtle alike) and catch a return flight to San José. From there, connect to your international flight — or continue your Costa Rican adventure. Whether you're heading home or diving deeper into the wild beauty of this country, you'll leave with unforgettable memories, new skills, and a heart full of purpose.


