Our trips use tourism-generated money to fund authentic, critical conservation missions, providing participants with hands-on experience in wildlife veterinary interventions, anti-poaching initiatives and community outreach across Africa, Asia, Central and South America, whilst ensuring the funds go directly to the field.



By partnering closely with reserves, local communities, and national and regional conservation agencies, we ensure that every mission delivers measurable impact for both wildlife and the people who live alongside it. Beyond the field, our experiences inspire travelers to become active stewards of the natural world, returning home with a deeper understanding of conservation challenges and a lasting commitment to support global efforts.

Wilde Tracks' adventure began on the African continent. However, based on its successes in **South Africa, Namibia, and Tanzania**, Wilde Tracks has expanded its innovative model to other critical regions around the world. In addition to our founding countries, we are currently operational in **Ecuador, Peru, the Galapagos Islands, Belize, Guatemala, Costa Rica, Somaliland, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Australia, Thailand, Laos and Uganda, as well as global mobile missions spanning all continents.** These areas present similar challenges - habitat fragmentation and loss, human-fauna conflict, illegal wildlife trafficking and limited resources. By applying our proven ecotourism concept globally, we aim to strengthen the resilience of ecosystems and support communities facing threats related to biodiversity loss by continuously scaling our reach.

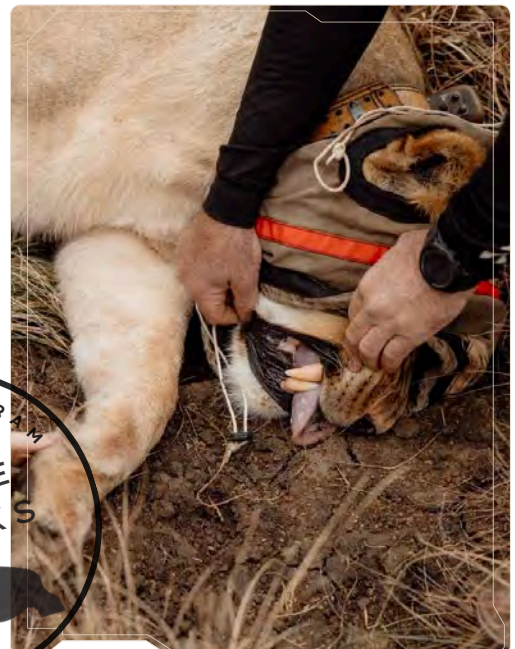
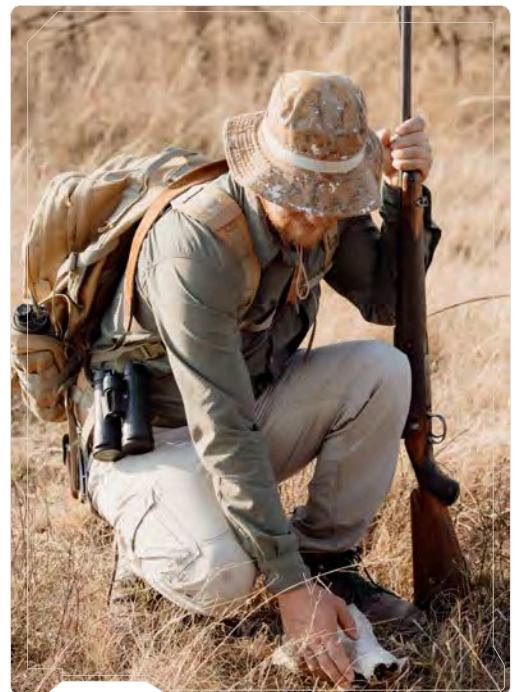
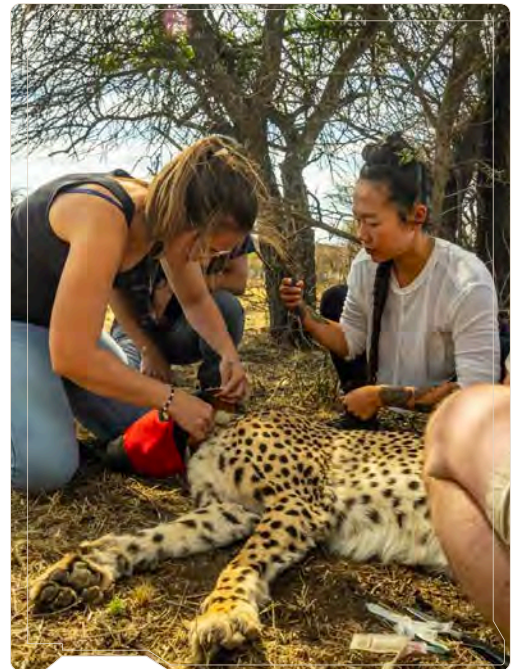

# 7 Day Itinerary

## Important note:

This itinerary is provided as an example and may be adjusted depending on the reserve requirements, as well as weather conditions, conservation team availability, wildlife movements, or other environmental factors. We kindly ask for your flexibility, as any changes will be made with guest safety and animal welfare as the highest priorities.



## Day 1: Arrival and Meet the Camp Ostriches

- Arrive at OR Tambo Airport in Johannesburg, South Africa
- Pick up directly from the arrivals hall and transfer 4-5 hours to the Big Five Game Reserve
- Bush camp orientation, meet the camp resident ostriches and enjoy dinner and your first campfire

## Day 2: Game Drives and Anti-Poaching Unit

- Sunrise breakfast in camp, followed by a beautiful game drive in a Big Five Game Reserve
- Enjoy a picnic lunch in the heart of the reserve at the infamous cascades, a series of waterfalls with grazing wildlife
- Return to camp and meet the reserve's anti-poaching unit. Learn how to track potential poachers and look for signs of poaching activity, including checking fence lines. Speak with the team to hear stories of the bush and how endangered wildlife is protected from the front lines
- Dinner is served at the camp, alongside the resident wildlife, under the night stars

## Day 3: Big Five Bush Walk and Wildlife Monitoring

- Breakfast at the camp, followed by wildlife monitoring activities, including species identification, movement mapping, and impact recording
- Return to camp for a cooked lunch and chance to refresh
- In the afternoon, enjoy a guided Big Five bush walk alongside experienced rangers and wildlife experts. This is a rare opportunity to see the Big Five on foot
- Dinner is served at the camp where you will be joined by the wildlife veterinarian to talk about the interventions, wildlife crimes and wildlife medicine

## Day 4: Hands-on Wildlife Veterinary Intervention

- Sunrise breakfast at the camp, followed by the start of the veterinary intervention day, working alongside a team of expert conservationists and a qualified veterinarian to carry-out crucial procedures to help protect endangered wildlife. These procedures may include rhino dehorning, predator collaring or other essential conservation interventions, depending on field requirements at the time
- Dinner is served back at camp, with an opportunity to debrief with the veterinarian and share success stories of the day

## Day 5: Telemetry, Tracking and Night-time Game Drives

- Morning scenic game drive to look for animals you haven't yet seen during the week
- Lunch at the camp followed by guided bush walk with non-dangerous game, focusing on animal tracking and the interpretation of tracks and signs
- Learn how to use telemetry equipment, and see if your skills are good enough to find the hidden collar
- Dinner at the camp, followed by a night-time game drive to observe nocturnal wildlife behavior

## Day 6: Community Outreach

- Full day of community activities. Visit a local Zulu community, learn about their culture, including a shared lunch and an introduction to wildlife conservation and community empowerment initiatives
- Spend time at a local school and creche, learn about the existing projects aimed at raising awareness and fostering stewardship among youth while supporting sustainable livelihoods
- Visit the Zulu "Grannies" to see their recycled plastic project, with the opportunity to purchase some of their handmade goods and souvenirs
- Dinner served at the camp

## Day 7: Farewells and Departure

- Early breakfast and say your farewells to the camp team
- Road transfer directly to the airport for onward travel

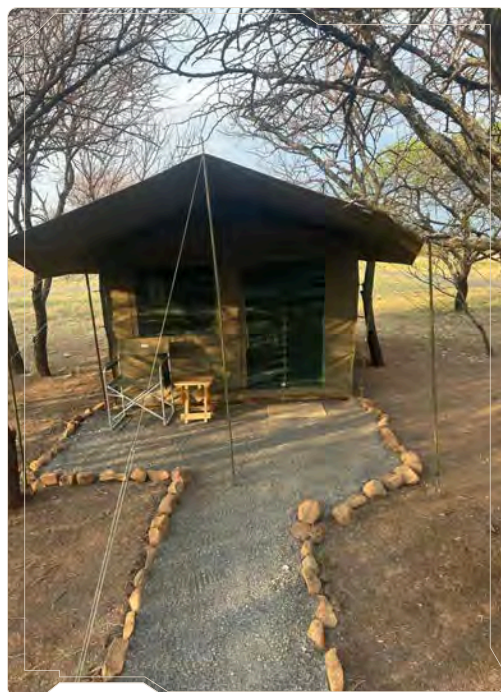

Connect with local communities by visiting schools, supporting education, exploring Zulu heritage or helping at a crèche, and meeting inspiring "Grannies" who upcycle plastic waste into colorful crafts. Join a hippo snare boat patrol to help protect aquatic wildlife and accompany anti-poaching rangers and their K9 units on patrols to detect snares and prevent illegal hunting. Visit the Snake Pharm research center to learn about life-saving anti-venom production and meet remarkable snake species.

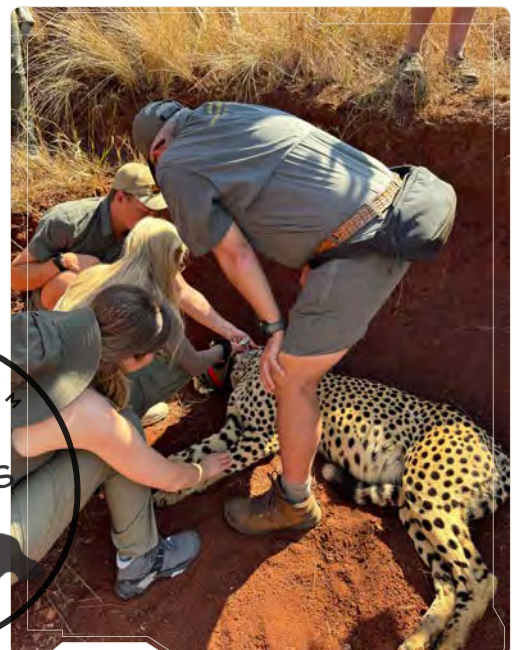
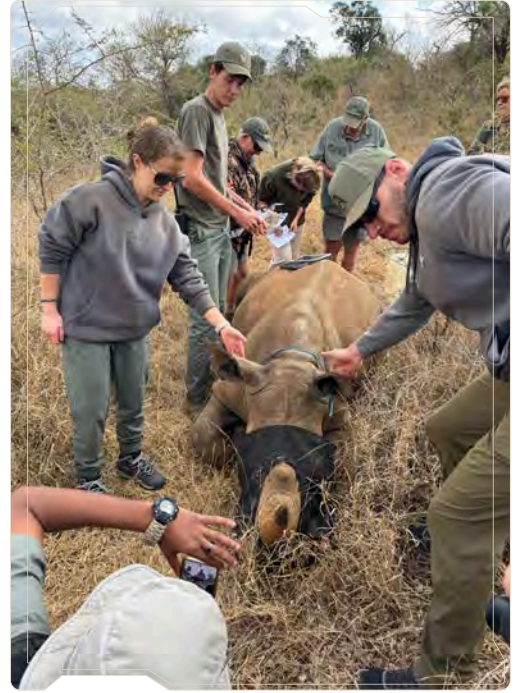

## Day 1: Arrival and Meet the Camp Wildlife

- Arrive at King Shaka Zulu airport in Durban, South Africa
- Pick up directly from the arrivals hall and transfer 3-4 hours to the Big Four Game Reserve
- Bush Camp orientation, meet the camp resident animals and enjoy dinner around your first campfire

## Day 2: Snake Pharmacology and K-9 Anti-Poaching Unit

- Breakfast at the camp, followed by a hands-on visit to the Snake Pharm, where ground-breaking anti-venom is researched and produced
- Enjoy an exclusive behind-the-scenes experience with the anti-poaching K9 unit, gaining insight into their critical conservation work
- Lunch at the camp and in the late afternoon, embark on a guided game drive
- Enjoy a dinner served at camp, overlooking the lake

## Day 3: Guided Bush Walk and Wildlife Monitoring on a Big Five Reserve

- Breakfast at the camp, followed by wildlife monitoring activities, including species identification, movement mapping, and impact recording on a Big Five Reserve
- Return to camp for a cooked lunch and chance to refresh

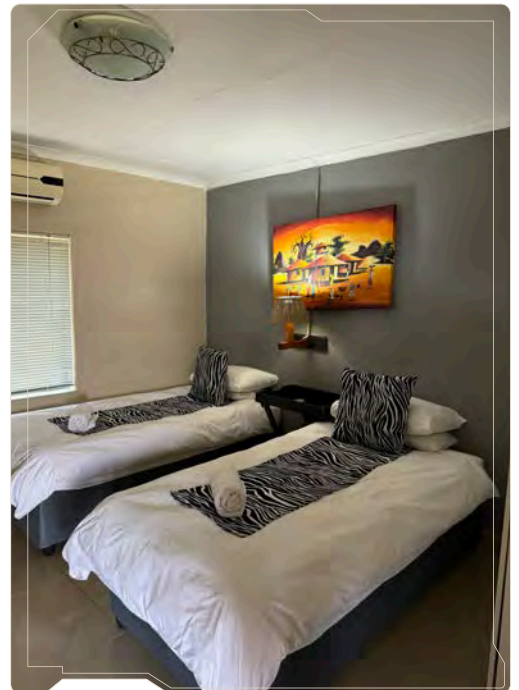

Get ready for an unforgettable adventure where you'll learn darting techniques and master various dart guns used in wildlife conservation. Work side by side with a seasoned wildlife and domestic vet, bringing 25 years of experience, as you dive into hands-on conservation efforts and make a real, lasting impact on wildlife preservation.

You'll actively participate in critical activities such as rhino dehorning, rhino DNA sampling and notching, mass and chemical game capture, all aimed at protecting endangered species. The week is full of conservation activities on a large array of wildlife species, as you shadow the behind-the-scenes work of a wildlife veterinarian. Attend fascinating introductory medical lectures on veterinary medicine and game capture, and learn the art of ethical game capture, helicopter safety, and even darting from the air!

Throughout the week, under strict professional supervision and in accordance with animal welfare standards, participants may be involved in:

- Monitoring vital signs
- Removing blindfolds
- Assisting with restraint
- Loading animals for transport

All activities are conducted following South African wildlife regulations and veterinary protocols.

# 7 Day Itinerary

## Day 1: Arrival and Meet the Camp Ostriches

- Arrive at Pietermaritzburg Airport, South Africa
- As the sun sets over the savannah, we gather for welcome sundowners and introductions. Meet your team and the resident ostriches, settle into the rhythm of the bush, and prepare for an unforgettable week

## Day 2: Darting from the Ground

- Morning briefing overview of the week's conservation operations, safety protocols, and ethical wildlife handling standards
- Introduction to: wildlife anaesthetics, game capture techniques in South Africa as well as veterinary protocols and animal welfare standards
- Get stuck into a practical darting session, including: Darting practice on a rifle and an air-pressured dart-gun, take part in a net-gunning simulation and test your newly acquired skills in a friendly darting competition

## Day 3: Mass Capture Operation

- Full day dedicated to large-scale wildlife capture
- Work alongside veterinarians and ground teams during coordinated operations used for: species relocation, population management, reserve planning
- Possible hands-on involvement includes: monitoring vital signs, applying and removing blindfolds, assisting with restraint, supporting loading procedures

## Day 4: Animal Management & Veterinary Interventions

- Full day dedicated to hands-on wildlife management activities
- Work alongside expert veterinarians and game capture teams to support with activities, which may include: health assessments, tagging and identification, treatment and monitoring, population management interventions, rhino dehornings, predator collaring and species relocation

## Day 5: Helicopter Darting Operations

- Experience the intensity of aerial wildlife management
- Observe and assist in: darting a moving target from the helicopter, be part of the rapid response ground coordination, learn about safe immobilisation procedures
- Be part of a unique opportunity to witness the precision and teamwork required in advanced wildlife conservation

## Day 6: Chemical Immobilisation and Translocation

- Witness targeted darting of specific animals selected for relocation or management purposes
- Get involved in the full operational cycle, from immobilisation and monitoring of anaesthesia to safe restraint and preparation for transport
- You will observe how animals are carefully loaded and relocated between reserves to support ecological balance, reduce pressure on habitats, and maintain genetic diversity

## Day 7: Farewells and Departure

- After a final breakfast at camp, gather for a structured debrief reviewing the week's operations, conservation outcomes, and technical learning points
- Transfers for onward travel back to the airport

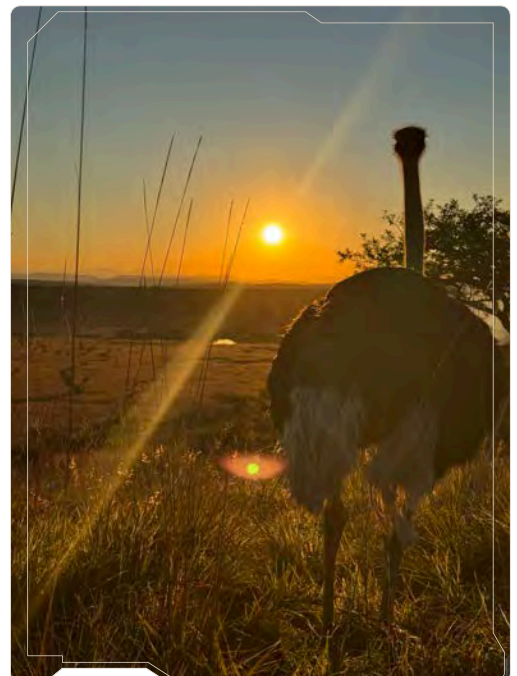
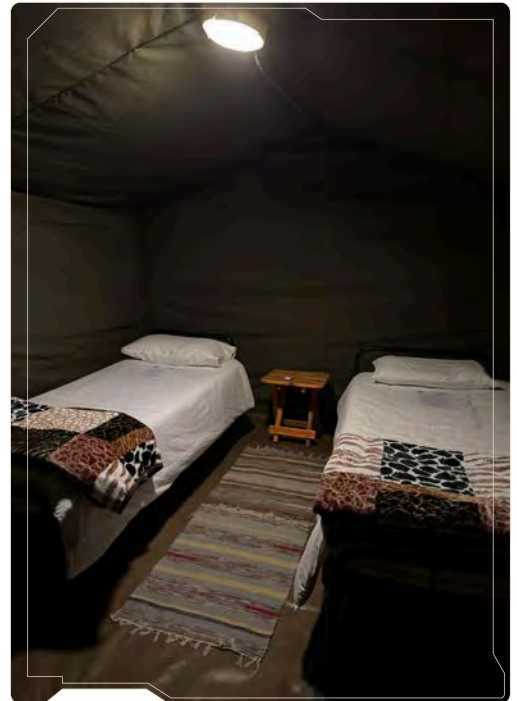
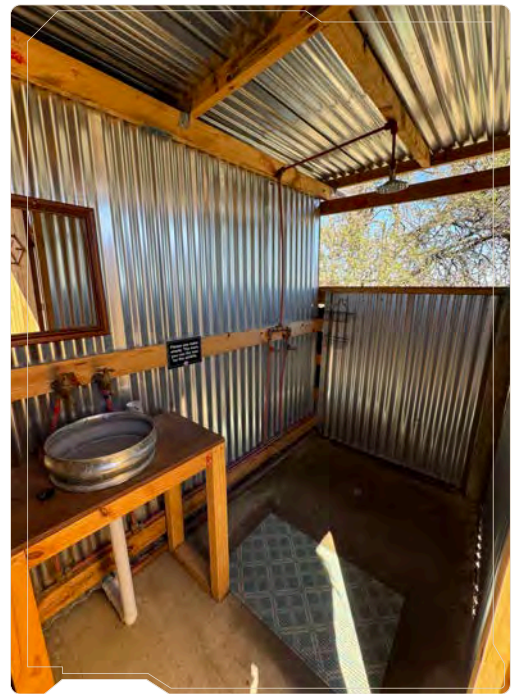

Start in Mto wa Mbu with a day alongside Maasai women, learning about their traditions and empowerment projects. After a scenic lunch, travel to Karatu to visit the Mwema Children's Center, where you'll meet the children and educators and prepare for upcoming activities. Support education by teaching subjects like English and Mathematics through interactive games and lessons.

Share meals, join gardening projects, and participate in the mobile school that brings learning to nearby communities. Enjoy cooking classes, art workshops, and sports, fostering fun and growth. Engage in wildlife conservation through storytelling, sensory games, and the Wildlife Club. Explore the local market with the children, take part in daily outdoor activities, and apply conservation knowledge in nature. Highlights include a day trip to Ngorongoro Conservation Area for hands-on ecological learning and two exciting Serengeti game drives to spot the Big Five and experience Africa's wild beauty.

## Day 1: Arrival in Tanzania

  - English academic support
  - Gardening & sustainability projects
  - Mobile school activities
  - Cooking classes
  - Sports and creative workshops

- Three full-days dedicated to hands-on conservation education, delivered in collaboration with local experts in conservation. These activities are fully funded by your participation

- These days aim to strengthen ecological literacy, inspire future conservation leaders, and connect community development with environmental protection

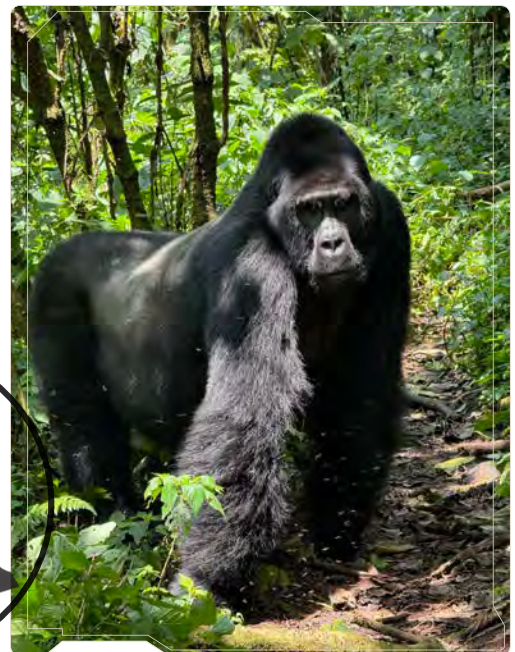

# 10 Day Itinerary

## Day 1: Welcome to Uganda

- Arrival at Entebbe International Airport
- Pick up at 12pm and meet your fellow travellers
- Enjoy a scenic 7-hour journey to Kasese. Once you reach the hotel, get to know your fellow travelers over a traditional dinner

## Day 2: Queen Elizabeth National Park & Kazingu Channel Boat Safari

- Eat breakfast alongside the resident elephants before embarking on a safari game drive in Queen Elizabeth Big Four National Park, offering the opportunity to observe elephants, buffaloes, antelopes and a wide variety of bird species.
- In the afternoon, a boat safari will take place along the channel connecting Lake Edward and Lake George, an area known for a high concentration of hippos, elephants, buffaloes and birdlife

## Day 3: Community Outreach and Women Empowerment Activities

- Meet our humanitarian partners who build community projects focused on: sustainable agriculture, land and resource management, youth education and empowerment and co-existence between wildlife and local communities. Meet the local children and distribute any donations you wish to bring.
- Meet the Inspire Girls Uganda Founder and her team who drive women empowerment programs, focusing on providing counselling and upskilling to single teenage mothers to restore hope and provide income-generating opportunities
- Take part in a workshop with some of the teenage mothers, to make recycled flip-flops out of worn tires, see how the women make locally-produced honey and visit the tailoring skills academy studio

## Day 4: Equator Stop and Local Coffee Talk

- Visit a local coffee NGO to see how the coffee is roasted and produced, get the chance to purchase your own!
- Along the way, stop at the Equator for a picture opportunity
- Transfer to a new accommodation in Busonga, replacing elephants with monkeys and take the afternoon to relax as you prepare for a very early morning of Chimpanzee tracking

## Day 5: Chimpanzee Tracking

- Early morning 1 hour transfer to Kalinzu Forest for Chimpanzee tracking. Enjoy learning about Chimpanzees by a local guide from the Forestry department. Spend 2-5 hours trekking
- In the afternoon, return for a rest at your hotel, surrounded by vervet monkeys and a beautiful panoramic viewpoint

## Day 6: Bwindi Impenetrable Forest

- Early morning departure for a 6 hour transfer to Bwindi Impenetrable Forest
- Meet the CTPH team and have the afternoon to rest. You can either take a walk and explore the souvenir shops in the town or join a paid optional afternoon activity, such as a coffee tour

## Day 7: Laboratory Research with CTPH & Pangolin Rescue Center Visit

- Morning dedicated to technical laboratory research with local conservation experts. Get stuck in, testing your own gorilla fecal samples under the microscope. There may even be the possibility to meet the infamous Dr Gladys, founder of CTPH. Learn about the One Health approach, linking wildlife, humans and environment
- In the early afternoon, visit the Pangolin Conservation and Rescue Center. If there are Pangolins at the center during your visit, you may get the opportunity to see them during their rehabilitation walks and possibly take part in a Pangolin release if required. Your trip contributes to purchasing tracking tags for released pangolins.

## Day 8: Gorilla Trekking

- After an early morning briefing and encouragement dance from the locals, you will head into the Impenetrable Forest in search for an ethical encounter with a Gorilla family. You will be accompanied by a professional guide and the trek duration can last anywhere from 1-7 hours, depending on the gorillas' location

## Day 9: Lake Mburo National Park

- 5 hour scenic road transfer to Lake Mburo. Spend the day relaxing by the lodge pool watching the baboons, or take an optional paid cycling or guided walking tour

## Day 10: Equator Crossing and Departure

- Make a photo stop at the equator monument near Masaka on your 4 hour transfer to Entebbe International Airport for a drop off at 3pm

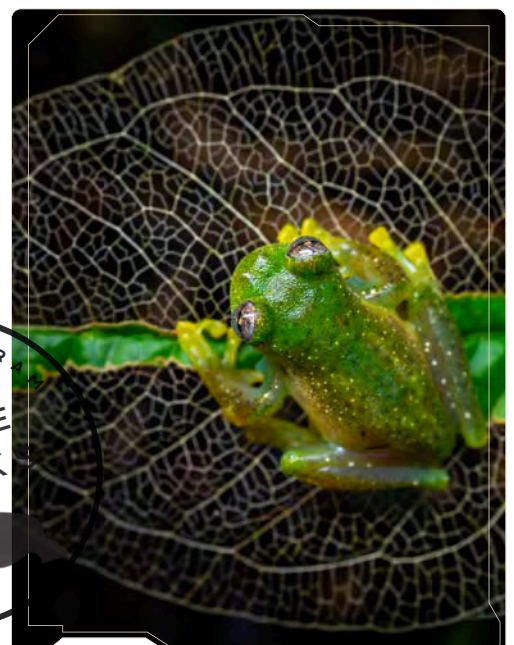
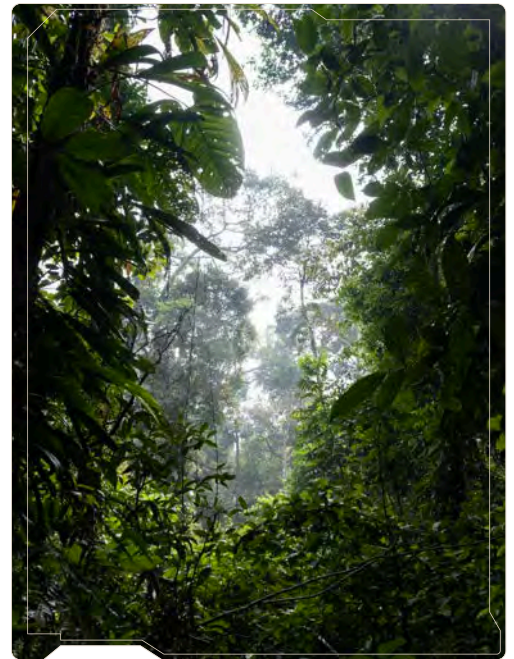

# 13 Day Itinerary

## Day 1: Cultural Quito

- The journey begins in Quito, the cultural and historical heart of Ecuador
- Arrive at your leisure, check into the hotel and feel free to explore the Andean soul of the country: the colonial historic center, local traditions, and the vibrant artisan markets before convening as a group for our first dinner.



## Day 2: Quito Markets and Journey to Baños

- In the morning, take the TeleferiQo Cable Car to see the beautiful panoramic landscape of Quito from high above the clouds
- Depart on a scenic 4-5 hour journey from Quito to Baños, home of waterfalls, volcanoes and hot springs.
- Enjoy a local traditional meal together

## Day 3: Waterfalls, Volcanoes and Hot Springs

- This day is dedicated to nature, activity, and relaxation, amidst spectacular landscapes. Explore the various waterfalls, hike the rolling valleys and visit the hot springs

## Day 4-7: Living with an Indigenous Community

- The journey begins with a 1 hour scenic propeller plan flight, deep into the Amazon jungle to reach the community, ancestral guardians of the forest, accompanied by expert guides, whom advocate for the rights of the Amazon's indigenous people
- These days are dedicated to community life: daily activities, traditional fishing and hunting for food, crafts, cultural and ritual ceremonies, traditional medicine, storytelling, and shared moments. It is an authentic immersion into the deep relationship between the people, the forest, and its wildlife
- If you are feeling brave, leave behind the hut accommodation, and spend two nights sleeping on the jungle floor, beds made of palm leaves, accompanied by the locals who will teach you to survive.
- Expect forest walks, wildlife observation and enjoy the sounds of the jungle. Canoe at night, looking out for caimans and other jungle wildlife. Leave behind the stress of life and immerse yourself into the jungle rhythm

## Day 8: Jungle Flight

- After leaving the community and enjoying breakfast, we return to Baños by scenic flight, before moving on to the next phase of the mission. The journey transitions from a cultural experience to active conservation of Amazonian biodiversity at the Amazonico Wildlife Rescue Centre in Tena, where the team of experts will welcome us with an introductory briefing

## Day 9-11: Amazonico Wildlife Rescue Center

- Three days are dedicated to field conservation programs at Amazonico Wildlife Rescue Centre, Ecuador's leading centre for the rehabilitation of wild animals that are victims of illegal trafficking
- Participants will work alongside the centre's experts in observation and monitoring, habitat care, and the management of over 400 animals in rehabilitation, including mammals, birds, and reptiles. They will also collaborate with local communities to support the protection of the Amazonian ecosystem
- No direct or unethical contact with the animals is allowed; this type of interaction is not part of the conservation approach we support. However, we will be actively involved in enrichment building, camera trapping, husbandry and general animal care and conservation

## Day 12: La Mariscal Market and Quito Exploration

- After a full journey of impact, fully immersed in jungle life and working to protect illegal trafficked wildlife, we make our way back to Quito for our last night together
- We will explore La Mariscal Market and enjoy a final traditional dinner.
- Spend your last night in Quito reminiscing and sharing best moments of the trip

## Day 13: Departure

- Finally, the journey ends and we wish you farewell, either continuing your stay in Ecuador, heading with us to the Galapagos, or returning home

# 10 Day Itinerary

This itinerary is provided as an example and may be adjusted depending on the research requirements, as well as weather conditions, conservation team availability, wildlife movements, or other environmental factors. We kindly ask for your flexibility, as any changes will be made with guest safety and animal welfare as the highest priorities.



## Day 1: Arrival in Durban

- Touch down in the vibrant city of Durban, where your journey kicks off with a warm smile and airport pickup by our friendly team
- Upon arrival at camp, take some time to settle after your flight, surrounded by nature. It's the perfect blend of comfort and wilderness. Unpack, unwind, and soak in the atmosphere

## Day 2: Dive Day - Sharks and Sea Snakes

- Free-diving and snorkeling surveys alongside marine experts to assist with sea snake monitoring, and if spotted, safely and ethically capturing individuals for essential health sampling (including blood collection) to support conservation research and anti-venom production
- Shark monitoring and ocean stewardship, where participants help identify sharks, document sightings, and assist teams in removing fishing lines or nets and carefully disentangling sharks when intervention is required
- Depart from Durban's coast via road transfer to a Big Four Game Reserve, where elephants and rhinos pass through your camp

## Day 3-5: Snakes and Snake Pharmacology

- Understand and learn safe and professional handling of snakes and reptiles
- Partake in hands-on venom extraction, anti-venom production and snake bleeding
- Get stuck in with snake husbandry, enclosure cleaning and snake care
- Attend snake monitoring and nature walks
- Participate in interactive snake lectures with expert Dr Donald Schultz (also featured on Shark Week)

## Day 6: Crocodiles and Lizards

- Understand and learn safe and professional handling of crocodiles and lizards
- Get stuck in with crocodile and lizard husbandry, including enclosure cleaning and enrichment
- Potentially relocate or move crocodiles caught in human-wildlife conflict, collect blood for any-venom production, participate in genetic testing and releasing of bred baby crocodiles
- Perform crocodile blood draws if required

## Day 7: Mammals, Birds and Invertebrates

- Get stuck in with mammal, bird and invertebrate husbandry, including enclosure cleaning and enrichment
- Potentially relocate or move wildlife caught in human-wildlife conflict









































# Turtle Season

Sea turtle activity varies each year, but this guide provides a general overview of the nesting and hatching seasons along the coastline. While nature follows its own rhythm, patterns have shown that Olive Ridley turtles are the most common visitors, with around 6,000 nests typically recorded each season. In contrast, the endangered Green Turtle is less frequent, with about 600 nests on average. High and low seasons depend on the species and weather patterns, so timing can shift from year to year. Use this guide as a helpful reference, but remember, these incredible creatures remain wild and unpredictable.

# WildeBioBlitz

Live amongst nature in elegant eco-cabins perched at the edge of a cliff within Ecuador's lush cloud forest, where you'll be immersed in one of the most biodiverse ecosystems on Earth.

Participate in hands-on field conservation efforts, including monitoring transects for the rapid-response tracking of the critically endangered Mindo Harlequin-Toad. You'll learn the art of scientific photography using standardized methods and work alongside renowned field biologists specializing in herpetology, ornithology, entomology, and mammalogy.

Activities include setting up light traps to photograph beetles, moths, and mantids against a white background, conducting bio blitz surveys, and installing pitfall traps to document secretive leaf-litter species rarely observed in the wild. You'll also help record bird species through visual and acoustic surveys, with mist nets deployed to capture data on elusive understory birds. Your efforts will directly support a fundraiser aimed at establishing two new protected areas in Ecuador, helping safeguard this remarkable biodiversity for generations to come.

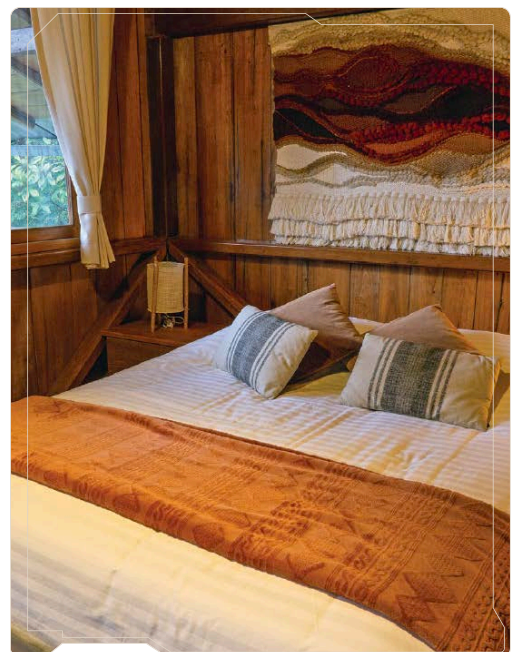
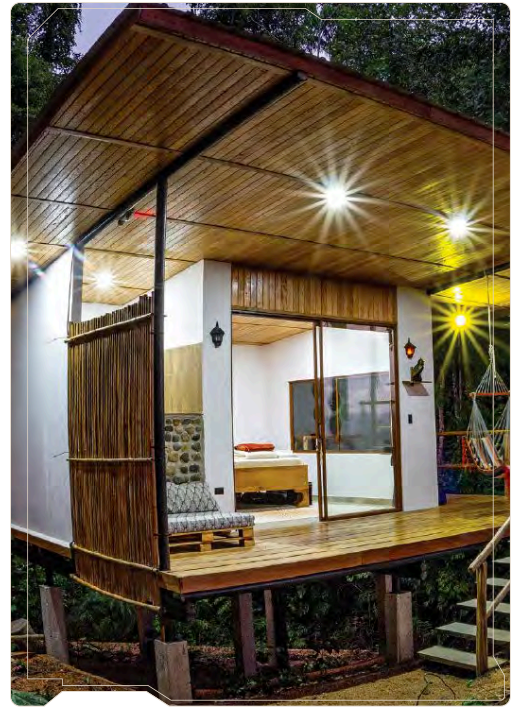

# Wilde Thailand

Participants have the opportunity to join one or both of our immersive conservation programmes, each focused on supporting the rescue, rehabilitation, and long-term welfare of animals impacted by human activity. Programmes are available with a minimum participation period of one week.

At the Wildlife Rescue Centre, participants assist with the daily care of rescued native wildlife through tasks such as preparing and distributing food, creating behavioural enrichments, cleaning enclosures and pools, and supporting general centre and forest maintenance. Resident animals include bears, monkeys, tigers, small cats, and a variety of other unique species.

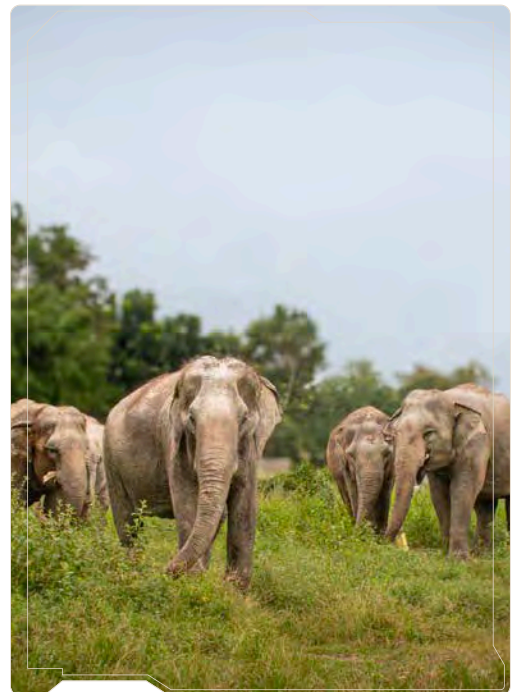
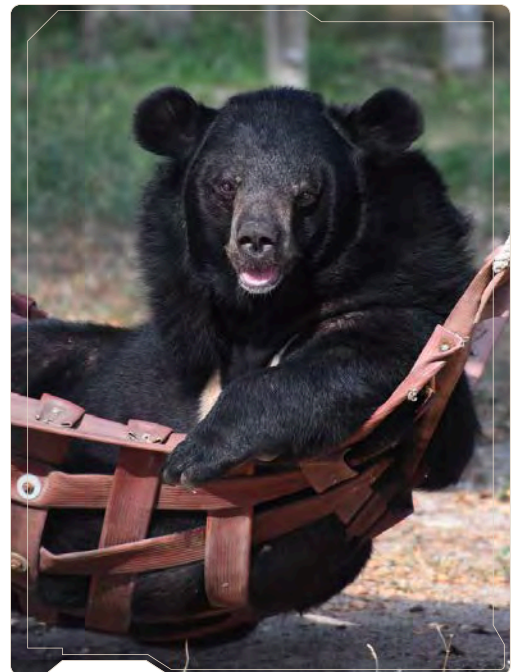
At the Elephant Refuge, participants contribute to the ethical care of rescued elephants in a strictly observation-based environment focused on welfare and rehabilitation. Activities include food preparation, environmental enrichments, enclosure cleaning, and refuge maintenance. The programme operates under a strict no riding and no swimming policy, ensuring elephant welfare remains the highest priority.

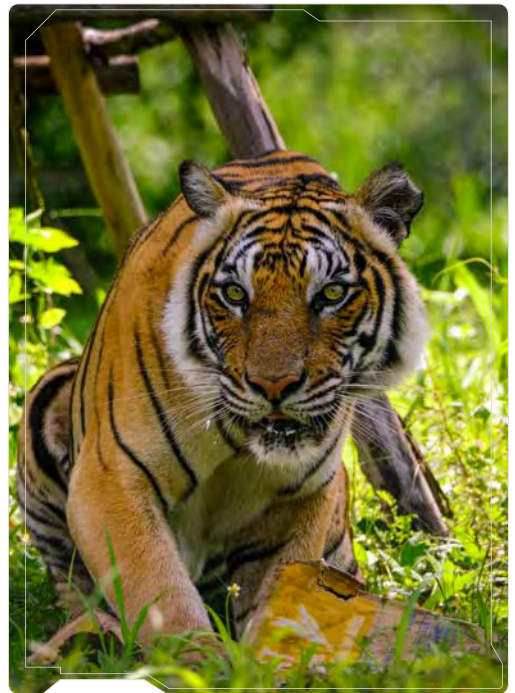

# WildeHorse

WildeHorse is an immersive conservation experience set within a 50,000-acre Zimbabwean wilderness actively being restored into a thriving Big 5 reserve. This is not a fixed itinerary program - each day is shaped by your interests, the movement of wildlife, and the rhythm of the bush. Guests explore vast, untamed landscapes on horseback, ride alongside a herd of over 40 horses, and experience wildlife encounters with elephant, buffalo, giraffe, hippo, and plains game moving freely across the reserve. Beyond riding, participants engage directly in conservation work including wildlife tracking, camera trap monitoring, species counts, habitat restoration, and anti-poaching awareness. You may also join horse training, groundwork, and care, or experience the unique opportunity to swim with horses in natural water. The program extends into sustainable land use and community connection, with opportunities to assist in farming activities, cattle movements, and visits to local schools and clinics that are directly supported by conservation tourism. Evenings bring stargazing under vast African skies, bush walks to ancient sites, and time spent immersed in the sounds of the wild.



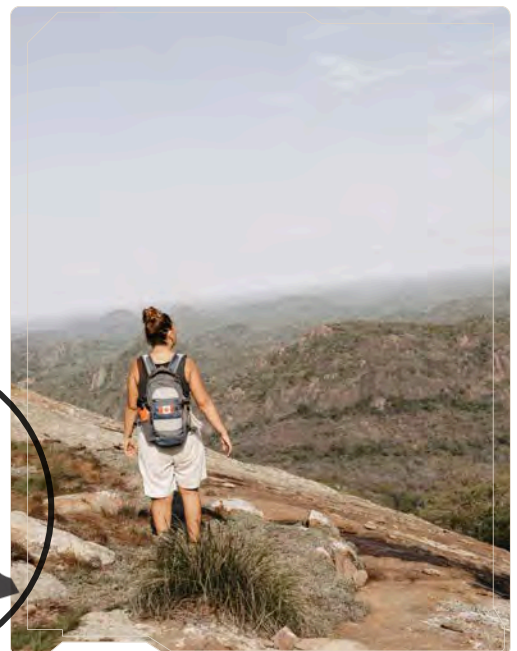

# WildeHorse

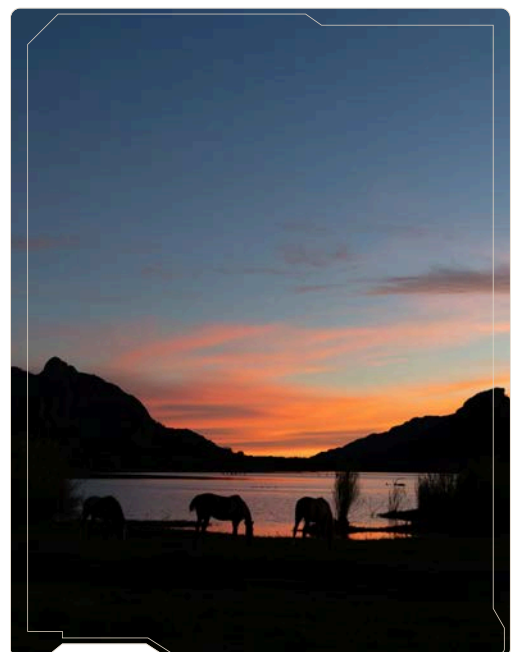
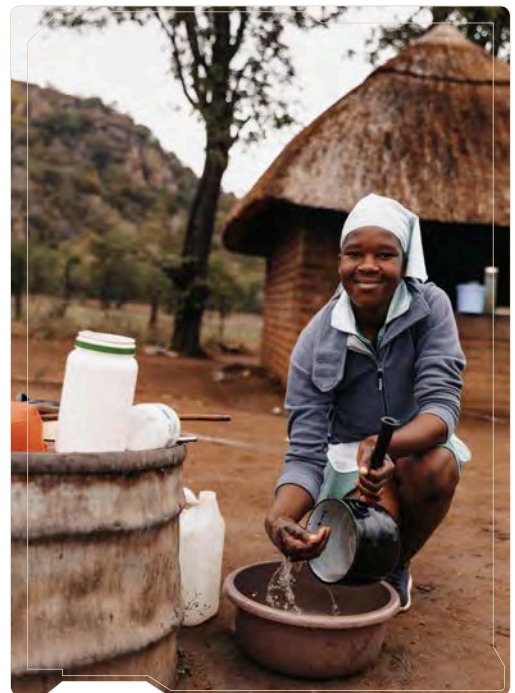
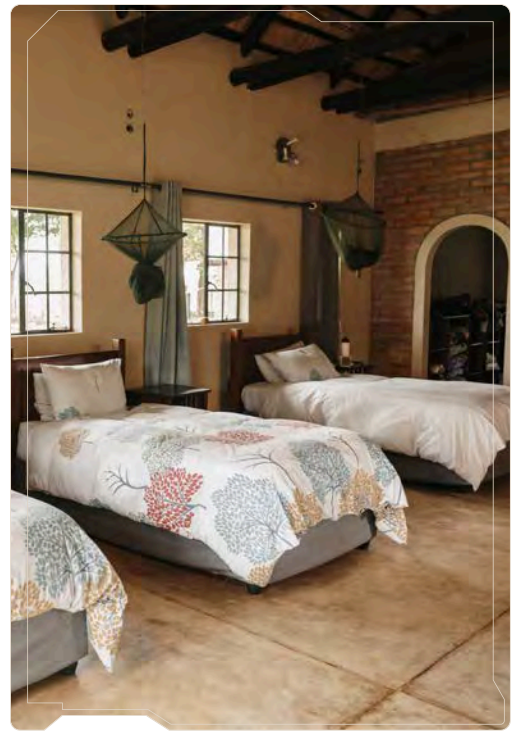
